Media Statement By Yangon Aerodrome Company Limited (YACL)

Biman Air Accident at Yangon International Airport on May 8 2019 Evening

Yangon, 8 May 2019 – A Biman aircraft carrying 30 passengers and 6 crew members skidded and overran the runway during heavy rain and poor visibility at Yangon International Airport ("YIA") this evening.

The accident involving a Bombardier Dash-8/400 aircraft, flight BG 060 from Dhaka skidded and overran the runway 18:51 local time during a landing attempt amidst heavy rain. After the accident, the runway was closed according to ATC ("Air Traffic Control") procedures.

All passengers and crew immediately received proper treatment, transportation and support. The official entities also reported to the craft side just after the accident.

Our immediate priority was to take care of passengers and crew members to ensure their safety and well-being. In a subsequent phase, we will coordinate with authorities and air operator in order to expedite the removal of the wreckage and to resume normal operations as soon as possible.

YACL responded immediately to the occurrence. There were no casualties thus far and the situation is under control.

Representatives from Myanmar's Department of Civil Aviation (DCA) and Aircraft Accident Investigation Branch (AIIB) reported to the crash site, and accident investigations will follow.
